New MHRA hub set to drive growth and jobs creation - "fantastic news" for region



The MHRA has launched a new hub in Leeds .
The Medicines and Healthcare products Regulatory Agency's (MHRA)
new Leeds hub has been hailed as "fantastic news" for the region, with
the potential to create
jobs and drive economic growth.

Leeds was selected for the new digital hub due to its expertise in digital health and strong academic base.

The new hub is set to build on the city's momentum – driving regional partnerships, attracting skilled talent and local investment.

It forms part of the MHRA's broader strategy to enhance regulatory agility, strengthen digital capabilities, and deliver better outcomes for patients, the public and industry.

The hub is also expected to enable closer collaboration with digital health networks, NHS organisations, and leading academic institutions nationwide.

Lawrence Tallon, chief executive of the MHRA, said: "By establishing an MHRA hub in Leeds, we're strengthening our ability to collaborate with partners across the North of England – bringing regulatory expertise closer to the people, organisations and innovations we serve.

"This hub will play a vital role in shaping the future of regulation, including how we harness technology to deliver regulation that meets the needs of patients, supports the health system, and drives life sciences innovation across the UK".

The new hub will be located in Wellington Place in Leeds city centre. The MHRA will initially recruit around 30 permanent, highly-skilled roles, focused on digital delivery, software development and data science, with the ambition for further expansion in future phases.

Transforming diagnostics. Empowering labs. Strengthening public health across Africa



The Early diagnosis and personalised care theme recently played a central role in the EXPANDIA project, led by ICGEB, which is working to transform how diagnostics are developed, selected, and implemented across sub-Saharan Africa.

The project is focused on:

Transferring cost-effective, real-time diagnostic tools
Supporting training for African scientists
Building local capacity to manufacture diagnostic reagents
Providing guidance to navigate regulatory environments

The team's contribution centred on co-developing a decision-making tool designed to help African public health laboratories choose diagnostic tests that best match their local clinical and operational contexts.

What was delivered:

A stakeholder survey and qualitative interviews across African public health labs

A comprehensive thematic evidence review

The development of a diagnostic decision-making algorithm

A full project report capturing insights, recommendations, and next steps

This collaborative work brought together expert voices from countries including Cameroon, Senegal, Zimbabwe, Nigeria, Ethiopia and other Sub-Saharan African countries. Together, they explored how diagnostics can be selected more effectively, with a focus on public health impact, affordability, usability, and long-term sustainability.
